

APPLICATION FEE

Students who wish to apply for financial aid must complete two forms: the 2008–2009 Financial Aid PROFILE of the College Scholarship Service and the 2008–2009 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Both the Financial Aid PROFILE and the FAFSA must be filed as directed and received by the respective processing agencies by February 15, 2008. The University of Notre Dame in Notre Dame, Indiana, must be listed on both forms as one of the institutions to receive the financial information. For the Financial Aid PROFILE, the institutional code for the University of Notre Dame is 1841. For the FAFSA, the institutional code is 001840. Students and parents are asked to submit signed copies of their 2007 federal tax returns to the Office of Financial Aid as soon as possible. Further questions may be directed to:
